Privacy Notice (How we use your information)

The categories of information that we collect, process, hold and share include:

- personal information (such as name, address, date of birth)

Why we collect and use this information

We use your data to:

- enable us to assess your application for a licence;
- correspond with you about your application/ licence
- monitor compliance with the conditions of any licence granted by the Council;
- take any necessary enforcement action;
- provide statistics to Government departments e.g. the Home Office

The lawful basis on which we use this information

We collect and use your information for the purposes of carrying out statutory functions under the Licensing Act 2003.

Collecting this information

The information you provide to us is mandatory under the Licensing Act 2003

Storing this information

We hold your data for the duration of any licence/ authorisation.

Who we share this information with

We routinely share information with:

- Kent Police and other bodies designated as Responsible Authorities under the Licensing Act 2003
- Other licensing authorities
- Internal services e.g. Planning Services, Environmental Health, Admin Services (in connection with Mayoral events) for the purposes of regulatory compliance
- The Cabinet Office as part of the National Fraud Initiative

Public Register

The Council is required to keep a public register which records details of licences/ authorisations it issues, temporary event notices it receives, other notices and applications

Why we share this information

We may share data with Kent Police on a statutory basis under Data Protection legislation. This data sharing enables the Police to carry out their statutory functions in relation to the prevention and detection of crime.

We share data with the Cabinet Office as we are required to by law for the purpose of assisting the prevention and detection of fraud

Requesting access to your personal data

- object to processing of personal data that is likely to cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- prevent processing for the purpose of direct marketing
- object to decisions being taken by automated means

- claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the Data Protection regulations
