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1. Introduction

Arup was appointed by Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council (TMBC) to prepare a Stage 2 Green Belt Assessment (GBA). It is intended to provide a robust local review of the Borough's Green Belt to help inform the emerging Local Plan. This spatially focused and granular study has identified and assessed the performance of defined sub-areas (Figure 1) against the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF, 2024) Green Belt purposes (a) – (e):

- a) To check the unrestricted sprawl of the large built-up areas;
- b) To prevent neighbouring towns merging into one another;
- c) To assist in safeguarding the countryside from encroachment;
- d) To preserve the setting and special character of historic towns; and
- e) To assist in urban regeneration, by encouraging the recycling of derelict and other urban land.

The assessment also considers the role of the sub-areas within the wider Green Belt (Strategic Green Belt Assessment)¹ and the strength of sub-area boundaries in relation to the NPPF Green Belt boundary definition. A final recommendation for each sub-area is presented, including whether any boundary mitigation is likely to be required.

For the purposes of plan making, any land that is not judged to strongly contribute to any one of purposes (a), (b), or (d) and that is not restricted by the application of policies in footnote 7 of the NPPF (2024) can be identified as grey belt land. The results of the Stage 2 GBA purposes assessment were filtered to isolate sub-areas which do not contribute strongly to any one of purposes (a), (b), or (d). This land has been identified as provisional grey belt. It has also been noted where sub-areas are covered by the National Landscape designation, to assist the Council with the application of footnote 7 later in the plan-making or decision making processes.

The context, full method and relevant definitions of terms used within this assessment (e.g. 'historic town', 'large built-up area', and so on) can be found in the accompanying Methodology Report.



2. Key findings

2.1 Introduction

This section summarises the key findings from the assessment of the 136 sub-areas against the NPPF purposes, consideration of the role of the sub-areas as part of the wider strategic Green Belt, provisional grey belt status, consideration of boundaries and categorisation and recommendations for each sub-area. The detailed proformas setting out the assessment for each sub-area can be found in the Annex Report. Maps showing the results of each part of the assessment by settlement can be found in Appendix A.

2.2 Purpose (a)

Purpose (a): To check the unrestricted sprawl of large built-up areas

The findings of the purpose (a) assessment are presented in Table 1 and Figure 2. A total of 136 sub-areas scored 0 against purpose (a). This is because no settlements within or directly adjacent to the borough were identified as large built-up areas.

2.3 Purpose (b)

Purpose (b): To prevent neighbouring towns from merging

The findings of the purpose (b) assessment are presented in Table 2 and Figure 3. The majority of sub-areas (128) do not meet this purpose, making no discernible contribution to preventing towns from coalescing. The remaining eight sub-areas have been assessed as performing weakly on this purpose.




2.4 Purpose (c)

Purpose (c): To assist in safeguarding the countryside from encroachment

The findings of the purpose (c) assessment are presented in Table 3 and Figure 4. The purpose (c) assessment considers the character of each sub-area, and the scores demonstrate the range of urban to rural characters present across the sub-areas. The majority of sub-areas (89) were considered to perform strongly against purpose (c), demonstrating a 'strongly unspoilt rural' or 'strongly rural' character; and therefore play an important role in preventing encroachment into the countryside.

Nineteen of the sub-areas have a 'moderately rural' character, with limited perception of encroachment on all or part of the sub-area, and/or from including dispersed built form/ structures which do not overtly detract from a countryside character. Twenty-one sub-areas were assessed as having a 'semi-urban' character and seven a 'largely urban' character, and hence perform weakly against the purpose.

2.5 Purpose (d)

To preserve the setting and special character of historic towns

The findings of the purpose (d) assessment are presented in Table 4 and Figure 5. The majority (131) of the sub-areas do not meet this purpose, as they make no contribution to preserving the setting of a historic town nor do they contribute to the special character of a historic town. Two sub-areas perform weakly and one sub-area performs moderately against this purpose. Two sub-areas perform strongly against this purpose, given their important role in preserving the setting and special character of a historic town.




2.6 Purpose (e)

To assist in urban regeneration, by encouraging the recycling of derelict and other urban land.

The findings of the purpose (e) assessment are presented in Table 5 and Figure 6. As set out in section 4.2.5 of the Methodology Report, purpose (e) was assessed at the whole District level due to the inability to differentiate how an individual assessment area contributes to this purpose. On the basis of the analysis presented in the Methodology Report, the whole district was assigned a score of '1' or 'weak' performance against this purpose. This value was assumed for all constituent sub-areas within the Borough.

2.7 Overall NPPF performance

The overall NPPF performance findings are presented in Table 6 and Figure 7. Based on the previous purpose (a) to (e) assessments, each sub-area is assessed to perform either strongly, moderately or weakly against the NPPF purposes overall. As all NPPF purposes are given equal weight, the strongest purpose score for each sub-area dictates its overall performance.

Of the 136 sub-areas, 89 perform strongly overall, whilst 20 perform moderately and 27 perform weakly overall. None of the sub-areas do not meet any of the purposes.

2.8 Grey belt identification

For the purposes of plan-making, grey belt is identified as any land that is not judged to strongly contribute to any one of purposes (a), (b), or (d) and that is not restricted by the application of policies in NPPF footnote 7. As set out in the Methodology Report, within a GBA it is only possible to provisionally identify grey belt based on the purpose scores, and final confirmation of grey belt status will be achieved through wider plan making or through development management processes when NPPF footnote 7 can be taken fully into account.

Provisional grey belt findings are presented in Table 7 and Figure 8. Based on the purpose assessments, each sub-area has assessed as a 'yes' or a 'no' as provisional grey belt, judged by whether a sub-area scores 'strongly' against purposes (a), (b) or (d).

Of the 136 sub-areas assessed, 134 are provisionally identified as grey belt.






2.9 Strategic Green Belt Assessment

Reflecting the granular focus of the Stage 2 Green Belt Assessment, additional qualitative assessment was undertaken to identify the role played by sub-areas as part of the wider Green Belt, and the likely impacts of their release on the performance of the wider Green Belt. A summary of the strategic assessment findings is provided in Table 8 and Figure 9.

2.10 Categorisation and Recommendations

Each sub-area was categorised as to whether the sub-area (or part of it) should be considered further by the Council. A summary of the categorisation, together with a summary of all elements of the assessment, is provided in Table 9.

The overall recommendations of the Stage 2 GBA are thus:

- 69 sub-areas are recommended for further consideration if removed from the Green Belt, these areas are judged to be unlikely to result in harm to the wider Green Belt; and
- Four sub-areas are outlined for partial further consideration.

Each recommended sub-area or part sub-area has been assigned a unique reference number. In some cases, wider Green Belt land has been included as part of the recommended area to avoid leaving behind 'slivers' or islands of Green Belt, which would otherwise risk the integrity of the remaining Green Belt. The extent and location of the wider Green Belt land included for this reason is, like the rest of the report, merely a recommendation. As such, when considering them for release, the Council may consider in some cases that minor alterations may be justified in order to achieve a more robust boundary.

2.11 Boundary Considerations

The analysis of sub-area boundaries considered, in line with NPPF requirements, the strength of the boundaries if a sub-area were removed (wholly, or partially, depending on assessment recommendations) from the Green Belt. Where boundary weakness was identified, mitigation may be required, for example through strengthening existing partial boundary features or the creation of a new boundary feature. The boundary consideration for each sub-area can be found in the assessment pro forma in the Annex Report. This analysis was for information only and did not affect recommendations.





Conclusions 3.

3.1 Green Belt assessment

This study has examined the performance of the Green Belt within Tonbridge and Malling against the Green Belt purposes, as set out in the NPPF (2024). A total of 136 sub-areas were identified for this assessment.

The sub-areas were defined using a four-stage process, as detailed in the Methodology Report, with the area of search primarily focussed on land around higher tier settlements i.e. the top four tiers within the emerging settlement hierarchy, as well as areas surrounding accessible locations in the Green Belt that did not lie within the top four tiers of settlements. These locations have been identified by the Council as likely foci for growth in the emerging spatial strategy for the new Local Plan.

Critically, the assessment also considered the role and importance of sub-areas in terms of the function of the wider Green Belt. For example, it considered whether the release of sub-areas might result in 'holes' in the Green Belt, which do not comprise existing inset areas or potential extensions of inset areas. Consideration was also given to potential impacts upon the relative strength of the Green Belt boundary and whether new boundaries would be defined 'clearly, using physical features that are readily recognisable and likely to be permanent (in line with Paragraph 149 (f) of the NPPF).

Of the 136 sub-areas assessed, 63 are recommended for retention in the Green Belt. For sites retained in the Green Belt, national Green Belt policy should continue to apply.

The remaining 73 sub-areas are recommended for further consideration (Figure 10).

- 69 sub-areas have been recommended for further consideration—if removed from the Green Belt, these areas are unlikely to result in harm to the wider Green Belt; and
- 4 sub-areas have been recommended for partial further consideration -- if partially removed from the Green Belt, these areas are unlikely to result in harm to the wider Green Belt.

The Stage 2 sub-areas recommended for further consideration cover a total of 473 hectares of Green Belt land.² This represents 2.77% of the total designated Green Belt land in Tonbridge and Malling Borough.

3.2 **Grey belt assessment**

Taking the results of the purposes assessment, a total of 134 sub-areas which do not contribute strongly to any one of purposes (a), (b), or (d) have been identified as provisional grey belt. As defined in the NPPF, grey belt excludes land where the application of policies relating to the areas or assets in footnote 7 to the NPPF (other than Green Belt) would provide a strong reason for refusing or restricting development. As set out in the Methodology Report, the analysis contained within the GBA only forms part of the evidence for the footnote 7 judgement. Therefore, the Council should review whether the application of policies relating to footnote 7 would provide a strong reason for refusing or restricting development in any of these locations, once more detail is known for sites and broad areas for growth later in the plan making or decision making processes. Once this final exercise has been completed, the Council will be able to confirm grey belt status.

² For sub-areas recommended for partial further consideration, this figure includes only the part recommended for further consideration.

3.3 Potential amendments to the Green Belt

NPPF 2024 paragraph 148 introduces a sequential approach to the release of Green Belt land: "Where it is necessary to release Green Belt land for development, plans should give priority to previously developed land, then consider grey belt which is not previously developed, and then other Green Belt locations." When applying this approach through proposed release of Green Belt, consideration still needs to be given to promoting sustainable patterns of development. The NPPF further states that it is necessary to consider whether "the site's location is appropriate with particular reference to paragraphs 110 and 115 of this Framework" (NPPF 2024, paragraph 148). Paragraphs 110 and 115 focus on sustainable development locations and sustainable transport solutions.

Therefore, it is important to note that the recommendations set out in this report will not automatically lead to the release of land. The areas identified through this study as warranting further consideration and those identified as provisional grey belt will need to be subject to more detailed assessment and consideration in terms of the wider balance of planning factors. Ultimately this review will sit as just one part of a wider suite of evidence base documents used to inform future plan-making. Following this study, it will be for the Council to make decisions determining which areas might be released from the Green Belt as part of updating the Local Plan, in line with NPPF Paragraph 148.

In this Green Belt assessment, once the methodology excluded sub-areas which are wholly or predominantly affected by major constraints, all recommendations were made based on the performance of sub-areas against NPPF purposes, and their performance in the context of the wider Green Belt. Suitability in terms of sustainability, deliverability, infrastructure and wider site-specific or strategic planning considerations has not been taken into account in the recommendations. Rather, it falls to TMBC to further assess the sustainability and deliverability of areas of land assessed through the Stage 2 GBA as part of the wider plan-making process. Should further work demonstrate that sites are not sustainable or deliverable, the Council may over-ride the recommendations of this document, and consider that the sub-areas should be retained within the Green Belt.

As noted previously, the relative strength of boundaries was not a determining factor in the final recommendations given it may be possible in certain circumstances to secure mitigation to strengthen currently weak boundaries or to provide new boundaries where gaps exist (e.g. through site allocations policies). While this assessment notes where this might be required, the decision on the necessity to strengthen existing, or create new boundaries, will be for the Council to take, taking into account how such mitigation might be secured.


The Council will also need to carefully consider whether, in accordance with the NPPF, there are any exceptional circumstances that justify Green Belt boundaries being altered through the Local Plan review. At that time, the Council will need to consider the intended permanence of the Green Belt boundary in the long term, to ensure any proposed boundaries are capable of enduring beyond the Plan period. Furthermore, as part of the exceptional circumstances case, the NPPF 2024 requires a test of: "whether the release of Green Belt land would fundamentally undermine the purposes (taken together) of the remaining Green Belt across the plan area as a whole." (paragraph 146). The accompanying PPG explains that "in reaching this judgement, authorities should consider whether, or the extent to which, the release or development of Green Belt Land would affect the ability of all the remaining Green Belt across the area of the plan from serving all five of the Green Belt purposes in a meaningful way".


Therefore, once the combination of potential Green Belt sites for release is known, the assessment of fundamentally important areas within the Stage 1 Main Report can be


